Sports Premium Proposed Spending 2023/2024

Background:

In 2017 the government doubled the amount of Sport Premium funding schools receive. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding, however it is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

The money **must** be spent making **additional** and **sustainable improvements** to the **quality** of physical education (PE), School Sport and physical activity offered.

This should;

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities already offered.
- Build capacity and capability within the school.
- Ensure that improvements made now benefit the pupils joining your school in future years.
